Genesis 1:26-28 (NASB) 26 Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; and let them rule over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over the cattle and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." 27 God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. 28 God blessed them; and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it; and rule over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

Genesis 1:31 (NASB) God saw all that He had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

Genesis 2:8-9 (NASB) The LORD God planted a garden toward the east, in Eden; and there He placed the man whom He had formed. 9 Out of the ground the LORD God caused to grow every tree that is pleasing to the sight and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

Genesis 2:15-17 (NASB) 15 Then the LORD God took the man and put him into the garden of Eden to cultivate it and keep it. 16 The LORD God commanded the man, saying, "From any tree of the garden you may eat freely; 17 but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat from it you will surely die."

Genesis 3:1-13 (NASB) 1 Now the serpent was more crafty than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said to the woman, "Indeed, has God said, 'You shall not eat from any tree of the garden'?" 2 The woman said to the serpent, "From the fruit of the trees of the garden we may eat; 3 but from the fruit of the tree which is in the middle of the garden, God has said, 'You shall not eat from it or touch it, or you will die.'" 4 The serpent said to the woman, "You surely will not die! 5 "For God knows that in the day you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." 6 When the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the

eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make *one* wise, she took from its fruit and ate; and she gave also to her husband with her, and he ate. 7 Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loin coverings. 8 They heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. 9 Then the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" 10 He said, "I heard the sound of You in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself." 11 And He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" 12 The man said, "The woman whom You gave *to be* with me, she gave me from the tree, and I ate." 13 Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?" And the woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

Ezekiel 28:13-19 (NLT) 13 You were in Eden, the garden of God. Your clothing was adorned with every precious stone—red carnelian, pale-green peridot, white moonstone, blue-green beryl, onyx, green jasper, blue lapis lazuli, turquoise, and emerald—all beautifully crafted for you and set in the finest gold. They were given to you on the day you were created. 14 I ordained and anointed you as the mighty angelic guardian. You had access to the holy mountain of God and walked among the stones of fire. 15 "You were blameless in all you did from the day you were created until the day evil was found in you. 16 Your rich commerce led you to violence, and you sinned. So I banished you in disgrace from the mountain of God. I expelled you, O mighty guardian, from your place among the stones of fire. 17 Your heart was filled with pride because of all your beauty. Your wisdom was corrupted by your love of splendor. So I threw you to the ground and exposed you to the curious gaze of kings. 18 You defiled your sanctuaries with your many sins and your dishonest trade. So I brought fire out from within you, and it consumed you. I reduced you to ashes on the ground in the sight of all who were watching. 19 All who knew you are appalled at your fate. You have come to a terrible end, and you will exist no more."

Isaiah 14:11-16 (NASB) 11 'Your pomp *and* the music of your harps Have been brought down to Sheol; Maggots are spread out *as your bed* beneath you And

worms are your covering.' 12 "How you have fallen from heaven, O star of the morning, son of the dawn! You have been cut down to the earth, You who have weakened the nations! 13 "But you said in your heart, 'I will ascend to heaven; I will raise my throne above the stars of God, And I will sit on the mount of assembly In the recesses of the north. 14 'I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will make myself like the Most High.' 15 "Nevertheless you will be thrust down to Sheol, To the recesses of the pit. 16 "Those who see you will gaze at you, They will ponder over you, *saying*, 'Is this the man who made the earth tremble, Who shook kingdoms,

Revelation 12:7-9 (NASB) And there was war in heaven, Michael and his angels waging war with the dragon. The dragon and his angels waged war, 8 and they were not strong enough, and there was no longer a place found for them in heaven. 9 And the great dragon was thrown down, the serpent of old who is called the devil and Satan, who deceives the whole world; he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him.

Luke 10:18 (NASB) And He said to them, "I was watching Satan fall from heaven like lightning.

Genesis 3:14-24 (NASB) 14 The LORD God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, Cursed are you more than all cattle, And more than every beast of the field; On your belly you will go, And dust you will eat All the days of your life; 15 And I will put enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and her seed; He shall bruise you on the head /crush your head/, And you shall bruise him on the heel." 16 To the woman He said, "I will greatly multiply Your pain in childbirth, In pain you will bring forth children; Yet your desire will be for your husband, And he will rule over you." 17 Then to Adam He said, "Because you have listened to the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree about which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat from it'; Cursed is the ground because of you; In toil you will eat of it All the days of your life. 18 "Both thorns and thistles it shall grow for you; And you will eat the plants of the field; 19 By the sweat of your face You will eat bread, Till you return to the ground, Because from it you were taken; For you are dust, And to dust you shall return." 20 Now the man called his wife's name Eve, because she was the mother of all the living. 21 The LORD God made garments of skin for Adam and his wife, and clothed them. 22 Then the LORD God said, "Behold, the man has become like one of Us, knowing good and evil; and now, he might stretch out

his hand, and take also from the tree of life, and eat, and live forever"—
23 therefore the LORD God sent him out from the garden of Eden, to cultivate the ground from which he was taken. 24 So He drove the man out; and at the east of the garden of Eden He stationed the cherubim and the flaming sword which turned every direction to guard the way to the tree of life.

Isaiah 7:14 (NASB) "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, a virgin will be with child and bear a son, and she will call His name Immanuel ['God with us'].

Micah 5:2 (NASB) "But as for you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, *Too* little to be among the clans of Judah, From you One will go forth for Me to be ruler in Israel. His goings forth are from long ago, From the days of eternity."

<u>Isa 9:2</u> The people who walk in darkness Will see a great light; Those who live in a dark land, The light will shine on them.

<u>Isa 9:6</u> For a child will be born to us, a son will be given to us; And the government will rest on His shoulders; And His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace.

Isa 9:7 There will be no end to the increase of *His* government or of peace, On the throne of David and over his kingdom, To establish it and to uphold it with justice and righteousness From then on and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will accomplish this.

Mal 4:2 "But for you who fear My name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its wings; and you will go forth and skip about like calves from the stall.

Luk 1:26 Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city in Galilee called Nazareth, Luk 1:27 to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the descendants of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. Luk 1:28 And coming in, he said to her, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord *is* with you." Luk 1:29 But she was very perplexed at *this* statement, and kept pondering what kind of salutation this was. Luk 1:30 The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; for you have found favor with God.

<u>Luk 1:31</u> "And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name Him Jesus. <u>Luk 1:32</u> "He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David; <u>Luk</u>

1:33 and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and His kingdom will have no end." Luk 1:34 Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" Luk 1:35 The angel answered and said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; and for that reason the holy Child shall be called the Son of God. Luk 1:36 "And behold, even your relative Elizabeth has also conceived a son in her old age; and she who was called barren is now in her sixth month. Luk 1:37 "For nothing will be impossible with God." Luk 1:38 And Mary said, "Behold, the bondslave of the Lord; may it be done to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

Mat 1:18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: when His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child by the Holy Spirit. Mat 1:19 And Joseph her husband, being a righteous man and not wanting to disgrace her, planned to send her away secretly. Mat 1:20 But when he had considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife; for the Child who has been conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. Mat 1:21 "She will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." Mat 1:22 Now all this took place to fulfill what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet: Mat 1:23 "BEHOLD, THE VIRGIN SHALL BE WITH CHILD AND SHALL BEAR A SON, AND THEY SHALL CALL HIS NAME IMMANUEL," which translated means, "GOD WITH US." Mat 1:24 And Joseph awoke from his sleep and did as the angel of the Lord commanded him, and took Mary as his wife, Mat 1:25 but kept her a virgin until she gave birth to a Son; and he called His name Jesus.

Luk 1:39 Now at this time Mary arose and went in a hurry to the hill country, to a city of Judah, Luk 1:40 and entered the house of Zacharias and greeted Elizabeth. Luk 1:41 When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb; and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. Luk 1:42 And she cried out with a loud voice and said, "Blessed *are* you among women, and blessed *is* the fruit of your womb! Luk 1:43 "And how has it *happened* to me, that the mother of my Lord would come to me? Luk 1:44 "For behold, when the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby leaped in my womb for joy. Luk 1:45 "And blessed *is* she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what had been spoken to her by the Lord."

<u>Luk 1:67</u> And his father Zacharias was filled with the Holy Spirit, and prophesied, saying: <u>Luk 1:68</u> "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, For He has visited us and accomplished redemption for His people, <u>Luk 1:69</u> And has raised up a horn of salvation for us In the house of David His servant— Luk 1:70 As He spoke by the mouth of His holy prophets from of old—<u>Luk 1:71</u> Salvation FROM OUR ENEMIES, And FROM THE HAND OF ALL WHO HATE US; Luk 1:72 To show mercy toward our fathers, And to remember His holy covenant, Luk 1:73 The oath which He swore to Abraham our father, <u>Luk 1:74</u> To grant us that we, being rescued from the hand of our enemies, Might serve Him without fear, Luk 1:75 In holiness and righteousness before Him all our days. Luk 1:76 "And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; For you will go on BEFORE THE LORD TO PREPARE HIS WAYS; <u>Luk 1:77</u> To give to His people *the* knowledge of salvation By the forgiveness of their sins, Luk 1:78 Because of the tender mercy of our God, With which the Sunrise from on high will visit us, <u>Luk 1:79</u> TO SHINE UPON THOSE WHO SIT IN DARKNESS AND THE SHADOW OF DEATH, To guide our feet into the way of peace."

(God's Anointed One & His Anointing)

Mass: An abundant collection or gathering

Luk 2:1 Now in those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus, that a census be taken of all the inhabited earth. Luk 2:2 This was the first census taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. Luk 2:3 And everyone was on his way to register for the census, each to his own city. Luk 2:4 Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, Luk 2:5 in order to register along with Mary, who was engaged to him, and was with child. Luk 2:6 While they were there, the days were completed for her to give birth. Luk 2:7 And she gave birth to her firstborn son; and she wrapped Him in cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. Luk 2:8 In the same region there were *some* shepherds staying out in the fields and keeping watch over their flock by night. Luk 2:9 And an angel of the Lord suddenly stood

before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them; and they were terribly frightened. <u>Luk 2:10</u> But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will be for all the people; <u>Luk</u> 2:11 for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. <u>Luk 2:12</u> "This *will be* a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." Luk 2:13 And suddenly there appeared with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, Luk 2:14 "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace among men with whom He is pleased." <u>Luk 2:15</u> When the angels had gone away from them into heaven, the shepherds began saying to one another, "Let us go straight to Bethlehem then, and see this thing that has happened which the Lord has made known to us." Luk 2:16 So they came in a hurry and found their way to Mary and Joseph, and the baby as He lay in the manger. <u>Luk 2:17</u> When they had seen this, they made known the statement which had been told them about this Child. Luk 2:18 And all who heard it wondered at the things which were told them by the shepherds. Luk 2:19 But Mary treasured all these things, pondering them in her heart. Luk 2:20 The shepherds went back, glorifying and praising God for all that they had heard and seen, just as had been told them. Luk 2:21 And when eight days had passed, before His circumcision, His name was then called Jesus, the name given by the angel before He was conceived in the womb.

Luk 2:22 And when the days for their purification according to the law of Moses were completed, they brought Him up to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord Luk 2:23 (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "EVERY firstborn MALE THAT OPENS THE WOMB SHALL BE CALLED HOLY TO THE LORD"), Luk 2:24 and to offer a sacrifice according to what was said in the Law of the Lord, "A PAIR OF TURTLEDOVES OR TWO YOUNG PIGEONS." Luk 2:25 And there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; and this man was righteous and devout, looking for the consolation of Israel; and the Holy Spirit was upon him. Luk 2:26 And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. Luk 2:27 And he came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to carry out for Him the custom of the Law, Luk 2:28 then he took Him into his arms, and blessed God, and said, Luk 2:29 "Now Lord, You are releasing Your bond-servant to depart in peace, According to Your word; Luk 2:30 For my eyes have seen Your

salvation, <u>Luk 2:31</u> Which You have prepared in the presence of all peoples, <u>Luk 2:32</u> A LIGHT OF REVELATION TO THE GENTILES, And the glory of Your people Israel." <u>Luk 2:33</u> And His father and mother were amazed at the things which were being said about Him. <u>Luk 2:34</u> And Simeon blessed them and said to Mary His mother, "Behold, this *Child* is appointed for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and for a sign to be opposed— <u>Luk 2:35</u> and a sword will pierce even your own soul—to the end that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed."

Mat 2:1 Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, Mat 2:2 "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we saw His star in the east and have come to worship Him."

Mat 2:9 After hearing the king, they went their way; and the star, which they had seen in the east, went on before them until it came and stood over *the place* where the Child was. Mat 2:10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. Mat 2:11 After coming into the house they saw the Child with Mary His mother; and they fell to the ground and worshiped Him. Then, opening their treasures, they presented to Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

<u>Luk 3:16</u> John answered and said to them all, "As for me, I baptize you with water; but One is coming who is mightier than I, and I am not fit to untie the thong of His sandals; He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

<u>Luk 3:21</u> Now when all the people were baptized, Jesus was also baptized, and while He was praying, heaven was opened, <u>Luk 3:22</u> and the Holy Spirit descended upon Him in bodily form like a dove, and a voice came out of heaven, "You are My beloved Son, in You I am well-pleased."

Luk 4:16 And He came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up; and as was His custom, He entered the synagogue on the Sabbath, and stood up to read. Luk 4:17 And the book of the prophet Isaiah was handed to Him. And He opened the book and found the place where it was written, Luk 4:18 "THE SPIRIT OF THE LORD IS UPON ME, BECAUSE HE ANOINTED ME TO PREACH THE GOSPEL TO THE POOR. HE HAS SENT ME TO PROCLAIM RELEASE TO THE CAPTIVES, AND RECOVERY OF SIGHT TO THE BLIND, TO SET FREE THOSE WHO ARE OPPRESSED, Luk 4:19 TO PROCLAIM THE FAVORABLE

YEAR OF THE LORD." <u>Luk 4:20</u> And He closed the book, gave it back to the attendant and sat down; and the eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on Him. <u>Luk 4:21</u> And He began to say to them, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."

1Jn 3:8 the one who practices sin is of the devil; for the devil has sinned from the beginning. The Son of God appeared for this purpose, to destroy the works of the devil.

Mat 28:18 And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.
